NJ Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) Aging & Disabilities Resource Connection (ADRC)



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- As a part of county government, the AAA directors are accountable to county freeholder boards as well as the state.
- AAAs/ADRCs are responsible for:
 - Assessing the needs of older adults and their caregivers;
 - Planning, coordinating, and determining services to be delivered and funds awarded to community-based agencies.
 - Serve as the lead for the county's ADRC partnership.

Community-Based Senior Programs

Super Storm Sandy Program

- As of July 27th, a total of 1,142 jobs were completed with 2,491 consumers having received information and assistance on the program. Overall, there were 1,045 approved applications with a total of \$7,985,969 spent.

State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)

- Provides unbiased Medicare information to help beneficiaries make informed health insurance decisions.
- Provides counseling and education.
- Helps resolve enrollment and claim problems.
- Develops outreach and partnership programs to inform underserved populations.
- Through the work of over 450 trained counselors, SHIP provided 32,000 hours of counseling and helped 52,000 beneficiaries in 2014.

- In partnership with local providers, the Health and Wellness unit is building a statewide infrastructure for the delivery of evidence-based disease prevention programs:

Adult Protective Services (APS)


- Federally-mandated crisis intervention program that responds to reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of vulnerable adults in the community.
- 21 county-based APS provider agencies are housed in:
 - County Boards of Social Services;
 - Area Agencies on Aging, and
 - Private non-profit organizations.
- 7,500 clients were served during the last full reporting year:
 - 4,500 investigations substantiated in which almost two thirds of clients were abused, neglected or financially exploited.
